# **Board Education**

A Board Oversight Committee was formed to receive complaints from the ACBL President, the Board of Directors, or the CEO concerning inappropriate behavior of a

board member. The committee will be the last 3 Presidents that are not officers of the Board.

#### Clubs:

Clubs are no longer required to run a Charity Game to receive a sanction.

## **National Committees**

A Tournament Disciplinary Committee was formed.

The committee is to include two players from each district noted for ethics (not necessary bridge ability). I will be appointing two from District 16. If you are interested and plan to attend the NABCs, let me know.

### **Bylaws:**

The ACBL now has available sample Bylaws for Districts as well as Units. If anyone is updating their bylaws, they should get a sample copy from the ACBL.

#### **Possible Sale:**

The CEO of the ACBL was authorized to continue negotiations and complete the sale of the Headquarters Building in Memphis.

#### **Conditions of Contest:**

The Mini LM pairs will be 6 sessions.

#### Finance:

2006 is estimated to lose between 150,000 & 200,000. In 2007 Tournament Director Fees will go up but Sanction fees will be lowered to help offset this increase and the budget shows a surplus of 175,000.

The Product Store sale was finalized in September and will allow the ACBL to cut down on overhead in 2007.
