Analysis

- 1. The only risk is losing a trump trick. Make the normal play of cashing the Ace, then finessing the Jack if East plays low.
- 2. You have potential losers in spades and diamonds. If you start with a spade finesse and it loses, you risk losing 3 diamonds. Cash the spade AK, club K, heart A, and discard diamond losers on club winners.
- 3. The only threat to your game contract is losing 2 spades when West holds Q10xx. The safety play to limit losers to 1 is to cash the spade King and lead low to the 9.
- 4. You have 8 winners. Your best line is to play for diamonds to be 4-2. Duck the first diamond to preserve your entry.
- 5. Protect against 4-0 trumps splits by ruffing a club, then leading a low heart to the 9.
