## Consider this suit: KJ32

## What are the static characteristics of this suit?

- 4 HCP (1/10 of the deck)
- You have a king and a jack.
- Bad spot cards
- What if your suit was KJT9 instead of KJ32?
- You have four cards in the suit.
- What if you had more or fewer cards in the suit?
- KJ ? -KJ3 ? -KJ32 ? -KJ632? -KJ6532 ? -KJ86532 ?
- KJT86532? - KJT876532? - KJT8765432? - KJT98765432 ?

## Dynamic Hand Evaluation

What do we mean by dynamic evaluation?

Dynamic means changing. Suits can go up and down in value during the auction.

What is value, anyway? A: Trick taking potential.

Value can be "offensive" value if our side declares the hand, or "defensive" value if the opponents declare.

## Consider this suit: KJ32

What can cause this suit to go up in value?

- Partner could open this suit.
- Partner could raise this suit after you bid it.
- RHO could open this suit or notrump. (Defensive value)


## Consider this suit: KJ32

What can cause this suit to go down in value?

- LHO could open or overcall in this suit or notrump.
- Partner shows shortness in this suit.


## Consider this suit: KJ32

When will this suit stay the same in value?

## Consider this suit: KJ32

When will this suit stay the same in value?

- Partner bids notrump.


## Consider this suit: KJ32

Example hand:

- x $x$
-KJ32
- xxxx
* xxx

Partner deals and opens 1 ゅ.

| LHO | Partner | RHO | You |
| :--- | :--- | :--- | :--- |
| - | $1 \uparrow$ | Pass | Pass |
| 2 | Double | $3 \uparrow$ | $3 \uparrow!$ |

## Consider this suit: KJ32

## Example hand:

```
*x
    \KJ32
    - Qxxx
    * Axx
```

This time, LHO deals and opens $1 \vee$.

| LHO | Partner | RHO | You |
| :--- | :--- | :--- | :--- |
| $1 \vee$ | 1NT | Pass | 3NT |

## Consider this suit: AT85

Static considerations:

- Same four points as KJ32
- Same length as before
- Good spot cards!


## Consider this suit: AT85

Dynamic considerations:
What could make this suit go up in value?

- You could have an eight-card fit.
- Not much else. Aces take tricks on offense or defense.

What could make this suit go down in value?

- Not much. Aces take tricks!

Partner raises to 3NT, all pass, they lead the king of clubs, and dummy hits:

## Consider this suit: AT85

Example hand:
A AKx
$\checkmark$ KTx

- KJT9x
* xx
- Qxx
- AJx
- Axx
- AT85

Auction: 1NT-3NT
Lead: K

## Consider this suit: AT85

Example hand:

- $A K x$
$\checkmark$ KTx
-KJT9x
+ XX
- Qxx
- AJx
- Axx
- AT85

The A gives you the ability to hold up.
The T gives you a second stopper.

Lead: K

## Consider this suit: AT85

Example hand:

- AKx
$\checkmark$ KTx
- KJT9x
* $x \mathrm{x}$
- Qxx
- AJx
- Axx
- KJ32

As a fun exercise, how do you play the hand when they lead the 4 , RHO plays the ace and comes back the 9 ?

Auction: 1NT-3NT
Lead: K
$\leftarrow$ Change the suit

You should bid 2NT, showing a game forcing raise in spades and at least four-card support.

Partner responds $3 \boldsymbol{\&}$, showing shortness in clubs.

## Let's put those tools to use!

Example hand: Jacoby 2NT
\& KT76
K942
K2
A72

Partner responds $3 \boldsymbol{\&}$, showing shortness in clubs.
Partner You

1a 2NT
${ }^{3}<\quad$ Cuebid!

## Let's put those tools to use!

The full hand:

- AQJ85
- AQT87
- Q8
$+4$
^ KT76
- K942
- K2
- A72

All partner needs is a $3 \star$ cuebid from you

Note: The deck normally contains 40 HCP. In this hand, you know that partner does not likely have the $\& K, \& Q$, or $\& J$.

You are playing with a 34-point deck!

The full auction might go:

| Partner | You |
| :--- | :--- |
| $1 ヵ$ | $2 N T$ |
| 3 | 3 |
| 3 | 4 |

(2 key cards without queen)

Apply the Losing Trick Count:

1) 1 loser in spades, 2 losers in hearts, one loser in each minor. Total of 5 losers.
2) $5+8=13$
3) $24-13=11$. You are on the verge of slam. What call did Timo make?

Timo just asked for aces and bid slam when I had two of them.
