Compton Wins Open Swiss; Baker Second in Women's Swiss by David Sokolow

Can you spell "draut"?
Apparently, neither can I. But that's pretty much what District 16 has experienced the last two nationals. This time, our lone victor was Chris Compton of Dallas, who prevailed in the Open Swiss Teams on the final day of the NABC. Chris is no stranger to the winner's circle, having won the prestigious Reisinger Boarda-Match Teams in 1989. Known to almost everyone who's played in a District 16 regional or sectional, Chris proved himself once again to be the cream of the District 16 crop. Con-

gratulations, Chris, on your win. Lynn Baker of Austin started this year in pretty much the same form as she ended last year. She followed up her win in the Women's Pairs in San Francisco with a runner-up finish in the Women's Swiss Teams in Detroit. As previously reported, Lynn's team has a bye to the semifinals of the Women's International Team Trials to select the U.S. women's team for the world championships in Beijing this fall. Good luck, Lynn! Lynn was not the only District 16'er to shine in the Women's Swiss. Austinites Tobi Sokolow and Mildred Breed roared back from the bottom of the pack on the final day to finish third, only 1.55 IMPs behind Lynn's squad. Nice going!

And speaking of squeakers.... In a virtual photo finish, Tobi and her husband, David, finished third in the national Mixed Pairs. With a round to go, they were a board behind the first- and second-place pairs, but a monster round of 123-1/2 out of 128 matchpoints, brought them within a hairsbreadth of the winners. Third is a very respectable finish in a national event, but let me tell you, a hairsbreadth feels like a gaping chasm when it's you who is oh-so-close to victory!

What about the NAOP events, you ask? Our district's standard-bearers did very well in Flight B. Jim Breihan and Mike Doyle of Houston finished fifth, while Phillip Jaeger of Austin and Thomas Hackenberg of Round Rock wound up eighth

The only other district play-



ers to scale the top 10 in NABC events were Dallas denizens Bart Bramley, who reached the quarterfinals of the Vanderbilt Teams, and Donna Compton, who was tenth in the Women's Pairs. Bart's accomplishment is particularly noteworthy because his team played four-handed against the top players in the world. Most Vanderbilt squads have six players, so everyone can sit out one or two segments (of 16 boards) a day. My hat's off to Bart and his teammates

The Summer NABC will be in Las Vegas July 17-27. The ACBL expects it to be the largest national *ever*, and why not? Those of you have never been to a Vegas NABC are in for a real treat: round-the-clock gaming; fabulous shows; incredible food, from 99 cent breakfasts to haute cuisine (*that* I can spell!); and four sessions of bridge every day (at 9 a.m.; 1 p.m.; 7:30 p.m.; and midnight). Lest you need any further incentive, just remember the city's motto: "What happens in Vegas stays in Vegas." No excuses!

One way to generate some excitement among the newer players is to have a tournament just for them. I urge the units to host a 0-50, 0-100, 0-200, 0-300 or NLM (non-life master) sectional tournament. The cost and space requirements can be quite low, especially for 0-50 or 0-100 tournaments. Because you probably won't get a whole lot of attendance (mostly locals), you can probably use a location where a local club meets. (You won't have to rent a large (expensive) hotel site or convention center site.) You might be able to run the tournament concurrently with a weekend club game. You can have as few as two sessions, e.g. Saturday afternoon and Sunday afternoon. By obtaining the permission (not automatic) of the District 16 Chief Tournament Director, Tom Whitesides, one of your local club directors can run the tournament. (This should cut down considerably on expenses.) You don't have to run an ad in the *Scorecard*. The *Scorecard* will still list your tournament, however (city and dates).

By the way, make sure that new players understand that they are allowed to play in any unrestricted tournament. New players often seem to have the misapprehension that they have to qualify or have a certain (large) number of masterpoints in order to play in an unrestricted sectional, regional or national tournaments.

If you would like to meet the District 16 President and give him a piece of your mind, make suggestions/criticisms and/or ask questions, I will have "office hours" at the Austin Regional Tournament this July. I will set up a "desk" in the lobby just outside of the main playing area and man the desk for an hour or so on Tuesday through Saturday. The time schedule will be printed in the regional newsletter. I also plan on having such "office hours" at the Dallas and Houston regional tournaments.

If you wanted to get out there was a monorail that for 50 cents would take you to a place called Greek town that had a Casino and 15-20 restaurants, Detroit had the misfortune to be between San Francisco and Las Vegas plus a snow storm the first Weekend. So, in spite of a great job by the Tournament Committee, the attendance was down about 1000 tables from the expected number. Speaking of Las Vegas, it will be very large, probably over 20,000 tables, so make reservations as soon as possible if you want to stay at the host Hotel.

On a personal note I am pleased to have been elected President for the 2008, we had a productive and

smooth meeting in Detroit. However there are many issues to be settled this year, some important ones are where our headquarters will be in the future. We are considering the Memphis area, thr Dallas area, the Atlanta area and Orlando. I hope we can resolve this soon. We also have issues with master-points for KO's and new rules for electronic devices in and around the playing areas, so 2008 will be a busy year. In addition I have been invited to many areas of the ACBL this year so I will not be in Texas as much as I would like (I will miss some of our good Texas Tournaments.).

2007 was a very good year for the ACBL with the number of sanctioned games going over 3,000,000 for the first time. Membership increased by almost 1000 members which is a trend I hope we can continue.

One of my priorities this year is publicity. I believe if social players and non bridge players read about our game in the newspaper or other media they will be more likely to try playing duplicate. I am asking every (Continued on page 3 Morse)

NAP SUMMER SWING by Betty Starzec

As the summer is approaching, so is the time you can get a lot of *RED* points just by playing in your local clubs! You can do this by participating in the North American Pairs (NAP) qualifying games. Those of you who are just starting to earn those elusive red and gold points recognize that they are won at NABCs and regional tournaments. Here is your chance to win them in your own backyard!

The NAP is a series of qualifying events culminating in a contest at the Spring NABC (it's Houston for 2009). During the months of June, July and August local clubs will have the first (Stage One) of the qualifying events.

Most clubs stratify their games in order to accommodate all players. Masterpoints are awarded at a sectional open rating and are ½ red and ½ black. Flight A is unlimited and open to all members. Flight B is for players with under 2000 masterpoints and Flight C is for non-Life Masters with fewer than 500 masterpoints. Clubs can have a "stand-alone" section for Flight C and may stratify the event with an under 100 masterpoint strat and another strat for under 20 masterpoints. The lower strats of Flight C award black points only, but they are still sectionally rated (which means you get more).

If you qualify to pro-

ceed to Stage Two, you will play in the Fall in your unit, typically one of the clubs in your area. Two-session unit qualifying events award a percentage of gold points to overall placers. This event is followed by the district NAP finals – where you have the chance to earn even more gold! (District finals will be held in Austin in January.)

If you are one of the top two finishers in your flight in the district finals, you will receive compensation to assist in your competition at the national level. Imagine you can represent District 16 at the Houston NABC in 2009 – and it all started at your club! If you don't see NAP qualifying games on your favorite club's schedule, please tell them you want to play in this event.


At a recent regional I picked up this hand:

bid, LHO overcalls 3D and partner

volunteers 3H showing 4 spades 5

Lots of work to do. I ruffed trick 1 and lead a club to the king which lost. A spade was returned which I won in hand to lead a club to the jack. LHO played the queen and lead another spade which I won in dummy as everyone followed. Now I played the jack of hearts which held the trick (it does no good for east to cover) following with the ace of hearts, west playing the nine RHO the queen, and exiting a heart as LHO pitches a diamond and RHO wins the King.



With RHO on lead there is no answer, a club puts declarer in dummy to pull the trump and claim. A spade return is the same, so east plays a diamond to tap the dummy. Declarer now plays good hearts through east. If he ruffs south overruffs and returns to dummy with a

Congratulations to Mike Passell and Nick Nickell on being elected the ACBL's Hall of Fame.

There are serious concerns about electronic devices; the ACBL believes conduct and ethical standards should be of the highest order. Starting in July with the Vegas National the following policy will apply to all nationally rated events at NABC's. Electronic devices, excluding health related equipment, capable of sending or receiving communication, including but not limited to headphones, earphones, cellular phones and minicomputers: 1. shall not be allowed in the playing areas, adjacent hallways, restrooms, or accessible break areas, and 2. shall not be used during a session. These restrictions shall apply to all pairs, team members, captains, coaches, recorders and kibitzers and shall apply throughout any actual playing segment. Violations of this policy shall result in a disciplinary penalty of one full board (or 12 imps at that form of scoring) for the first offence. A second offence shall result in disqualification from the event. Kibitzers violating this policy shall be removed from the playing area for the remainder of the session. Please leave your cell phone in your Hotel room or car. Do not take it to the playing area.

There was an error in ACBL score that resulted in some top bracket KO's in January and February awarding too many master points. The awards have been corrected retroactive to the beginning of the year. Some players will notice a reduction in their master point total.

The new Strength of field concept that forms the basis of the new master point formula in use appears to be working; however two adjustments have been made. A new reduction formula is in place for bracketed KO's that have fewer than 16 teams (about 4% reduction for each team less than 16). Also the master point cap for a team has been raised from 40.000 to 45,000 and the maximum award is made only if the bracket average is 40,000 instead of 35,000. In addition any 3 session team will have a reduction of 60% from a 4 session event even if a 4 session was scheduled.

The new laws will be available soon and will be effective September 8. 2008. On advice of the Competitions and Conventions Committee the Multi 2 Diamond convention (opening 2 diamonds showing a weak 2 in a major) will no longer be allowed in pair games. It will still be allowed in team games of 6 boards or more (Only in Flight A Regional and higher) effective date August 1, 2008.

The ACBL expressed its disapproval of all non-bridge related public statements and demonstrations by any Zone 2 representatives participating in an international bridge competi-

As a trial project a shortened minibridge school program was approved effective September 1, 2008. It will

be similar to the existing school program except that. 1. No text will be provided. 2. Teachers will receive a subsidy of \$200 for a class of eight hours of instruction and supervised play. 3. It will be permitted through the 6th grade level only.

The ACBL Code of Disciplinary Regulations was amended; interested parties should download the new version form the ACBL website. One of the changes prohibits lawyers from representing those charged in front of committees. This was done to simplify hearing and make them less of a courtroom like atmosphere.

New member secondary mailings have been started. This is a program that sends new members a second bulletin quarterly which provides information about the game, common conventions and non-timely items to help new members learn how to enjoy the ACBL experience.

Effective March 31, 2008 a new policy regarding STAC charges will go into effect. The change is that sponsoring organizations will be charged a total fee based on table count, whereas previously charges included a sanctions fee, director session charges, and miscellaneous charges.

Over 4th of July the first ever youth National Tournament will be held in Atlanta. If there are youth in your area do what you can to see that they attend and provide them with support.

The Union Game by Ira Hessel

When I was an undergraduate at CCNY most of my early afternoons were spent in the cafeteria which was great for studying and playing either chess or go. 4PM to 6 PM was wrestling practice. But between seasons I did chance upon the union where I tried my hand at bridge. While I had too much on my plate to get hooked then the seeds were sown for my favorite pastime.

As a graduate student in Austin in the 70's a few of my fellow students engaged me at the Tuesday night duplicate at The Union at The University of Texas. We often had well over 10 tables and the competition was quite inconstant ranging from neophytes to the already experienced and quite capable group led by the likes of Ken Schutze. (As early as 1974 Ken placed 7th in the Reisinger). But we did have our illusions and to this day those fond memories remain. The game was run by Ed (fast Eddie) Davis and his roommate Deputy Dawg. Many players that emerged from that group went on to achieve a large share of national successes. Ken won 3 Grand National Pairs with Jim Griffin, another regular. Many others are Gold LM's or higher. One of the strongest was Paul Burka who went on become an influential Editor at Texas Monthly. Paul was a strong influence of many of us. Although he does not get to play often, at the last Austin Regional Paul came out of hiatus to win the Swiss Teams with Ken. It was at this very comradish group I met Jim Musumeci, son of Aces coach MUS. A fine player in his own right Jim introduced me to backgammon.

The list of players was quite impressive. Besides the aforementioned, there are many players who accomplished a lot. Among the group who still play are Kerr Godfrey, Ed Davis, Steve Bruce, Paul Kelley, Dave Bugay, John Bowers, John Bromberg, Dale Crumbaugh, Ira Hessel and Dennis Sorenson. who not only won the Collegiate championship but also went on to win the ACBL top 500 one year.

Although he already an outstanding player we were often visited by the Sage of San Leana, Dr. George Pisk. Besides helping us on our way in bridge George was responsible for many of our nicknames. Not the least was "The Iron Monkey"

In the mid 70,s the Union closed for renovation and by the time it reopened the Union game sadly did not have the impetus to continue. We went on to play at the local duplicate club fondly run by Ray Robak. I always treasured the Saturday night Swiss where they served copious snacks and free beer! (A college students fondest wish.

I am always glad to see the old Union players and always hoped there would be other groups like that. It was what all bridge games should be. While learning the game from advanced players we had fun and had a great source of friendships and companionship.







Our favorite columnist, Laura Nash, consented to provide us with a heartwarming article about the first time she ventured into a duplicate bridge game. She was fortunate to have Henry and Bettye Weltman as the directors and as a result of the Weltmans' kindness and the players' courtesy, Laura was hooked good!

Thank goodness we have her in our unit! Here is her saga:

I think the year was 2002. With a couple of years of weekly rubber bridge under my belt, I forced a friend to try duplicate. (All I knew about it was it required boards. I dragged my mom's metal ones home from the estate sale many years before. Sentiment kept me from throwing them away). I'll admit this to you and nobody else: I actually looked for "Rubber Bridge" and "Party Bridge" in the phone book because I dreaded taking the "Duplicate" plunge. Guess what? Diving off the deep end was inevitable. The water was and still is fine!

We trekked over to Ft. Worth one the door. I told him we knew nothing but basic bridge. I found his game in the yellow pages, and we were here to find out whether or not we might like the fancy brand of the game. He wel-

comed us warmly, sat us down and began the initiation.

a convention card. He asked what we played. That would be 5-card majors, strong jumps, and Gerber. He quickly (!) got that filled in.

Next, he showed us a bidding box. After a few minutes of getting the thumb action just right, we were lifting magnificent bids like one club, two diamonds, three hearts, four spades, and six no trump out of the red boxes! With the pass, double, and STOP cards mastered, we were ready. To leave actually. But that might hurt Henry's feelings. We stayed.

Friday night. Henry Weltman met us at As the game started, he introduced us to the crowd, told everyone to be nice that we were brand new duplicate players - and left us to the experts. When it was over we were dead last with 43%. Bettye, Henry's wife, told me that was not bad at all; we were

playing against Ft. Worth's best. How does Garth Brooks' song go? "Glad we didn't know; the way it all would end; the way it all would go1/4"

Sam and I still remember every person who spoke, welcomed us to their table, asked about us, and helped us relax. It was a safe place for two people who were greener than the pass cards. So we came back. Henry and Bettye won us over, then the players, then the game.

If the Weltmans had not set a pleasant tone for the evening, we might never have tried duplicate a second time. And to that I say: I'd be a lot richer today. No, wait. Well, yes, I would be richer, but bridge is better than money: the friends, the challenge, the fulfillment can't be measured.

There are Henrys and Bettyes all over the world. Without fanfare, directors set up tables, hunt for last minute partners, buy snacks, clean up before, during, and after games. They pass out movement cards just to find last minute arrivals walking through the door and change it all without wincing. And why? For the love of this game.

Timid kitchen bridge players tiptoe to duplicate clubs across North America for the first time on a daily basis. Lives are often changed forever. When interviewed on CBS Sunday Morning recently, Warren Buffett made a statement to the effect that bridge becomes a very meaningful part of a person's life. It isn't learned in an hour or two or three. All true. And it isn't learned at all without support. So to all you "supporters" on all your levels: Applause!!

Sometime along about this time duplicate bridge sessions were started at the Abilene Country Club. These games were for Country Club members only and were held on Wednesday nights. Before too many years passed San Angelo and later Sweetwater began open duplicate sessions on Tuesday nights. It was not unusual for Abilene players to go occasionally to San Angelo and frequently to Sweetwater to participate in their duplicate games. The Monday night game in Abilene consistently had visiting players from many towns in a 90 to 100 mile radius of Abilene.

At some point the open duplicate bridge sessions were moved from the Wooten Hotel to the Windsor Hotel and for many years we played on the mezzanine on that hotel. Eventually, they grew tired of putting up with us and we started moving to other places like motels and, for a while, the Senior Citizens Center in Rose Park. Finally, in 1978 Jerry Mark con-

Finally, in 1978 Jerry Mark convinced the bridge players that we could build our own bridge building. He and I went before the Parks and Recreation Board of the City of Abilene and asked for permission for us to build the building in Rose Park. That Board approved our request and the bridge players entered into a lease

agreement with the City of Abilene to lease the land where the Mabel Lilius Bridge Center now sits. The lease is for ten years and is renewable at the end of each term. Consideration is \$10.00 per each ten years. The bridge building was built in 1978. Eugene Knabel of Hamlin was the general contractor. The building was 30' by 80' and total cost of the project was \$46,261.84. The building was paid for as follows: Individual Contributions,\$9,185.00

paid for as follows: Individual Contributions,\$9,185.00; Garage Sale,\$2,343.30; Calcutta, \$211.00; Abilene Bridge Club,\$7,522.54; Fort Phantom Bridge Unit, \$5,000.00; as well as a few personal loans. Total cost was \$46,251.84.

The loan was finally paid off in July 1986. Repayment came from game income and from income earned at our annual tournaments. The bathrooms were woefully inadequate (you couldn't sit down and close the stall doors at the same time) and there was no storage room, but we were overjoyed to finally have a place of our own that no one could throw us out of.

In 1991 we did an extensive remodeling of the Bridge Center. We added an extension to the east for handicapped accessible restrooms, a smoking room, and a storage room. We also added a handicapped accessible entrance to the building. Don Faulkner was the contractor and Newt Newberry was the architect. The total cost of the remodeling was \$62, 597.72.

In 2002 the unit did another remodeling of the Bridge Center. We bought new chairs, put down new carpeting and linoleum, insulated the attic, and repainted the kitchen. The \$11,673.82 cost of the remodeling was paid for with income from our regional tournament in 2001.

It is apparent that we have a considerable investment in our Bridge Center, but it is worth that investment to have a nice place of our own which we control and which is available at all times for our bridge games. I am grateful for all of the people who have worked and given through the years so that we might have this facility. I hope we can continue to enjoy it for many years to come.

And, we invite YOU to come play some bridge with us.
