

Under the leadership of Eric Snow, Toni Snow, & Betty Starzac the local volunteers did an amazing job with excellent food and entertainment every night. The attendance was about 9730 tables about 500 less than expected. This was a good but not great turnout I believe the local players were down a little because of the economy and the problems with driving downtown.

This was our year for charity, as we donated \$26,000 to 6 different charities during the Nationals.

#### Hamman Wins Open Swiss Teams; Sokolow Wins Women's Swiss; Suty and Hilton Win Silver Ribbon Pairs; Jackson and Gervais Win Red Ribbon Pairs















Nowhere was the concept of "home court advantage" more apparent than at the Houston NABC. District 16 players captured four national titles, two in team events and two in pairs. Throw in a second-place finish and two thirds for good measure, and you have a tournament for the ages. Here's the inside scoop

The legendary Bob Hamman of Dallas won the Open Swiss Teams. According to the Daily Bulletin, this was Bob's 50<sup>th</sup> national championship. Two more and he'll have one for every card in the deck. Don't bet against him! Bob also finished 3/4 in the Vanderbilt Teams, the premiere event at the Spring NABC. He almost didn't make it past the first day. Down 67 IMPSs at the half to the #64 seed, Bob's team orchestrated another legendary comeback to win by 11. You can savor the details in Daily Bulletin #6 on the web. No word adequately captures Bob's never-say-die attitude: "dogged"? "tenacious"? 'persistent"? supercalifragilisticexpialidocious"? [I get paid by the letter] For lack of a better word, he's just "awesome."

Tobi Sokolow of Austin won the Women's Swiss Teams for the fourth time. Her team led after the first day and never relinquished the She last won the Women's Swiss in 2002, the last time the nationals were held in Houston. Being both superstitious and optimistic, Tobi is rooting for the Spring NABC to be held in Houston every year!

Dan Suty of Houston and Jim Hilton, who recently moved to Austin, were victorious in the Silver Ribbon Pairs, an event open to bridge players who are 55 years of age or older. Their margin of victory was more than a board. Don't be fooled by the name—this event attracts a host of top-flight players; indeed, there were six world champions among the pairs finishing in the top 20. Kudos to Dan and Jim for an outstanding performance!

Daniel Jackson of Spring and Bill Gervais of Cypress won the Red Ribbon Pairs, a national event open to players with under 2,000 masterpoints. Their victory was not assured until the very last round, when they met and outplayed the secondplace pair. Good show!

With all these NABC winners, it would be easy to overlook the second and third-place finishers, but not on my watch. Greg Hinze of San Antonio and Nagy Kamel of Plano finished second in the IMP Pairs. with their Vanderbilt teammate and District 16 President Ira Hessel of San Antonio a close third. IMP Pairs is run like a pair game, but scored like a team game, so you don't have to agonize about overtricks as you do at match-points. Greg and Nagy are very consistent, which is a real asset in the IMP Pairs. It's a pleasure to see them succeed. In the Women's Swiss, Nancy Passell of Plano and Petra Hamman and Joan Jackson of Dallas were third, just a couple of victory points behind the Chinese national women's team. Nice going!

A veritable boatload of District 16 players made the top ten in national events. John Sutherlin, Dallas, was 5/8 in the Vanderbilt. In the Mixed Pairs, Babu Koneru, San Antonio, and Virginia Noelke, San Angelo, took fifth. Ken Schutze, Austin, and Hemant Lall, Dallas, were fifth in the IMP Pairs, while Barry Shaffer, Frisco, finished sixth in the Silver Ribbon Pairs. In the Women's Swiss, Mildred Breed, Austin, finished sixth; Peggy Sutherlin, Dallas, and Shawn Quinn, Richmond, were seventh; and Charlotte Blaiss and Carol Schoenhals, Lubbock, Linda Spangler, Duncanville, Ellen Hessel, San Antonio, Ann Brinker Schwall, Houston, and Carolyn Peters, Grapeland, ended up eighth. In the Open Swiss, Dan Morse, Houston, Tom Peters, Grapeland, Greg Hinze and Nagy Kamel tied for 7/8. Tobi Sokolow was ninth in the Women's Pairs. In the Open Pairs, Bob Hamman was eighth, and Hugh Hillaker, Grand Prairie, and Kimmel Jones, Euless, rounded out the top ten. Lastly, Eddie Bass, Austin, and James Breihan, Houston, finished tenth in the North American Open Pairs Flight B. Congratulations one and all on your accomplishments!

Accolades are also in order for the tournament chairs-Toni and Eric Snow and Betty Starzec—and their entire volunteer staff for an outstanding job. They set the standard on how a national should be run. Heartfelt appreciation from all those who were privileged to attend! (P.S. to Toni, Eric and Betty: What are you doing in the spring of

Here in District 16 we have done our part with a significant increase.

Club Rules. Clubs are now allowed to hold either a regular club championship (18+ boards) or shortened club championships (12-17 boards). The total number of club championships will remain the same as currently allowed. The overall awards for shortened club championships are 60% of regular club championships. The overall awards for shortened club championships, if held online, are capped at 4.5 masterpoints.

Stratified pair events at local, sectional and regional tournaments may be based, at sponsor option, on average masterpoints of the pair.

Any member who pays their dues within 90 days after their membership paid through date shall have their masterpoints recorded free of charge, their dues payment credited from the original paid through date, and no break in membership recorded. If some one won master

points when they were not paid up more than 90 days they can pay for the time period they won points and have them recorded if possible.

The board was addressed by both Gianarrigo Rona of Italy and John Wignall of New Zealand. These are the 2 announced candidates for the WBF Presidency in 2010.

The ACBL with the USBF is working on the possibility of having the 2010 World Championship in North America.

The Platinum Pair was authorized to start in March of 2010; this will take place at the same time as the 4 session Silador pairs but will be 6 sessions, Friday –Sunday. The Vanderbilt will start on Monday instead of Sunday and is the only other change. The event is open to anyone who has won 200 lifetime platinum points or 50 in the last 3 calendar years and to Grand Life and Platinum Masters.
