Quinn Wins Women's Swiss; Hamman Second in Open Swiss

This column was almost cancelled for lack of material. Thankfully, two of our district's veteran players came through with a first and a second on the final day of the Reno NABC. Otherwise the editors would have been scrambling for a front page ad to fill the space.

District 16's lone winner was Shawn Quinn of Houston, who won the Women's Swiss Teams. Obviously, moving from Poland to Houston, then from Houston to Switzerland has not hurt Shawn's game. Speaking of international travel, the Women's Swiss is a perfect example of how the nationals have changed over the last decade. It used to be the case that almost everyone who competed in an NABC event was from North America. No more! Two players on Shawn's team, four of the runners-up, and four on the third-place team were Europeans. The proliferation of foreign experts has made it that much more difficult to win a national. Well done, Shawn!

As I have noted before (May/June 2006), Bob Hamman of Dallas doesn't often get to play in the Open Swiss Teams—he's usually in the finals of the Vanderbilt on the last weekend of the spring NABC. But Bob's team made lemonade from the proverbial lemon of their early exit from the Vanderbilt by capturing second place in the Open Swiss.

Third place often gets short shrift in my column, but not this time around. The bronze medals (metaphorically speaking) go to John Zilic of Houston, who was third in the Mixed Pairs, and Mike Passell of Plano, who finished third in the Open Swiss Teams. Nice going, guys!

Despite the dearth of first-, second-, and third-place finishes, a bunch of District 16 players made the top ten in NABC events. Mike Passell placed 5/8 in the Vanderbilt. In the Women's Pairs, Rosemary Kelley and Claudette Hartman, Austin, were fifth, just ahead of Austinite Lynn Baker, Similarly, Barry Schaffer, Frisco, finished fifth in the Silver Ribbon Pairs, followed by Buddy Hanby, Spring. In the Open Swiss, Babu and Ira Chorush were fifth, Justin and Hemant Lall Dallas eighth, Steve Shirey, Fort Worth, and Ira Hessel ninth, and Mark Feldman, Austin, tenth. In the Women's Swiss, Tobi Sokolow, Austin, finished seventh, and Lynn Baker tenth. In the Open Pairs, Ira Hessel, San Antonio, was fifth, Bart Bramley and Chris Compton, Dallas, finished eighth, while Tom Peters, Grapeland, and John Zilic wound up tenth. Babu Koneru, San Antonio, and Ira Chorush, Houston, were ninth in the IMP Pairs. Last, but certainly not least, Nagy Kamel, Plano, finished tenth in the Platinum Pairs. Good job one and all!

The summer NABC will be held in New Orleans, from July 22 to August 1. As anyone who has ever attended a national in New Orleans can attest, it is THE BEST site for a national (okay, except for maybe Las Vegas). I mean, come on—the French Quarter, Café du Monde, Preservation Hall, Jackson Square, the aquarium, the Mississippi River, gambling at Harrah's-what more could you ask (except perhaps a bit less humidity)? It's no wonder New Orleans is one of the most popular convention sites in the world! Come find out for yourself. A bientot!

SPECIAL GAMES AT CLUBS

A committee had been formed that studied the pro's and con's of the special games in clubs that awarded sectional masterpoints for an extra \$1.00 per person. The ACBL, on their recommendation, changed the regulations starting July 1, 2010.

During February (Junior), April (Charity) and September (International), a club may choose to run any and all sessions for the named funds. In all other months clubs will be permitted to hold one special game a month per sanctioned session. The masterpoints awards for these games are reduced to 70% of Sectional rating. The cap of 6 points is maintained

MEMBERSHIP

Membership is doing well, even. after a large increase last year. We still have a small increase (170) in 2010. In addition, the loss of members in 2009 was the lowest we have seen in decades. Here in District 16 we are doing our part with our membership staying above the 9000 mark (9046) which, if it continues, will give us another Regional in 2012.

Regionals started 2010 with a bang with table count up considerably from last year. Our Houston Regional was over 3000 tables, which makes it one of ACBL's biggest .

The 2009 preliminary table count for club games is 2,844,236, of which 584,177 were from on-line games. The final numbers will be out soon.

SUMMER NAPS ARE HERE

Summer is approaching and so is the time for you to earn RED points at your local club. You can do this by participating in the North American Pairs (NAP) qualifying games. Typically, red and gold points are won at NABCs and regional tournaments. Here is your chance to win them in your own backyard.

The NAP is a four-stage event that will culminate in a contest at the Spring NABC in Louisville, Kentucky. During the months of June, July and August local clubs will have Stage One of the qualifying events.

Most clubs stratify their games in order to accommodate all players. Masterpoints are awarded at a sectional open rating and are ½ red and ½ black. Flight A is unlimited and open to all members. Flight B is for players with under 2000 masterpoints and Flight C is for non-Life Masters with fewer than 500 masterpoints. Clubs can have a "standalone" section for Flight C and may stratify the event with an under 100 masterpoint strat and another strat for under 20 masterpoints. The lower strats of Flight C award black points only, but they are still sectionally rated (which means you get more points).

If you qualify at the club level, then you move on to Stage Two. Stage

Two is a Unit final typically held at one of the clubs in your area. Twosession unit qualifying events award a percentage of gold points to overall placers. This event is followed by the district NAP final (Stage Three)-- where you have the chance to earn even more gold! District 16 final will be held in Austin, January 8-9, 2011.

Each District is able to extend invitations to the top 3 finishers of each flight to participate in the national final. If you are one of the top two finishers in your flight, you will receive compensation to assist in your competition at the national level. Because of such strong participation in District 16, we have been able to award the top 3 finishers compensation and have qualified 4 places in Flights A and B. We are hoping to win those extra spots for our District this year, but we need your participation to do it. Just think, you can represent District 16 at the Louisville NABC in 2011 and it all started at your club. If you don't see NAP qualifying games on your favorite club's schedule, please tell them you want to play in this

chieved Grand Life Master, the highest rank bestowed by the American Contract Bridge League (ACBL), in Feb. 2010.

Tipton achieved this award, while serving as founder and President of Helena Laboratories since 1966. He found and chairs Etoco, an independent Houston energy company. He serves his community and directly participated in emergency services in Beaumont through local disasters including hurricanes - Ike, Rita, and Gustav. His path of influence is long, wide and commend-

Tipton is also an internationally recognized clinical chemist. At Helena, he designs and manufactures diagnostic test kits and clinical laboratory instrumentation and supplies. His technical expertise and creativ-

ity, have generated a hundred plus patents, products, and approximately \$100 million annual revenues. Helena has been awarded the U.S. Secretary of Commerce "E" Award for excellence in contribution to the American economy through export operations.

Tipton also received the Van Slyke award sponsored by the American Association of Clinical Chemists. This is the highest academic award in Laboratory Medicine.

In 1997, he played on the team that won the Spingold Championship In the 1990's as past unit representative to the District 16 board, he was instrumental in bringing a regional tournament to the Beaumont area, and thanks to his efforts an additional sectional tournament. He has most generously underwritten countless club activities such as member directories tournament newsletters life master award parties and other special events. Tipton's many contributions to bridge in general and Unit 201 in particular, earned him the prestigious Texas Star Award.

The Spring National at Reno, or the "Biggest Little City in the World", was a stupendous success!! Credit goes to Kathy Hansen and her staff which did an outstanding job!!! The last Reno National was in the Spring of 2004, and had a table count of 14,954, this Spring National had a table count of 12,156.

Jay Baum, ACBL CEO, reported a total of 165,419 members. This reflects the amnesty promotional program along with new requirements for LMs as of January 1, 2010, which caused the surge in memberships.

Stratified Pair Events:

From the Board of Directors Minutes, Houston Spring NABC, March 9-12, 2009: Stratified pair events at local, sectional and regional tournaments may be based, at sponsor's option, on average masterpoints of the pair-Effective: May 1, 2009.

Special Games at Clubs Adjustments: The month of February is reserved for Junior Fund Games, the month of April is reserved for charity games and the month of September is reserved for International Fund games. In those months any and all ACBL sanctioned club sessions may be special games for the named funds. In the remaining nine months of the year, one game per month per sanctioned session may be a special game for either the Junior Fund, International Fund, Educational Foundation or charity. The masterpoint rating for all of these special games will be 70% of Sectional Rating maintaining the current cap of 6.00 master-points.

Charity Games in Clubs:

Any club that, in any calendar year, runs one or more allowed special local charity games that are sanctioned for extra masterpoints must make available for public inspection an accounting of all funds raised in such games no later than February 28th of the following calendar year.

Super Senior Pairs:

A Super Seniors Pairs (Age 70+) shall be established as an NABC+event: *to be held at the Fall 2010 NABC and continuing at each Fall NABC until further notice. *to be held the last two days of the FaLL NABC. *start time: 10AM and 3PM. *the event will consist of 2 qualifying and 2 final sessions, *the national formula for masterpoints will be used to award platinum points. *masterpoints will not count towards senior masterpoint races. *this event shall not qualify for Grand Life Master eligibility.

FALL 2017 NABC has been approved for San Diego, California, to be held at the Manchester Grand Hyatt.

gram continues to be a successful and popular resource for clubs and teachers in their efforts to reach out to beginner and/or newcomer players. The program subsidized advertising costs for 357 beginner/newcomer ad campaigns submitted by clubs and teachers in 2009.

In an effort to increase brand awareness for ACBL and provide a marketing tool for clubs and teachers. marketing has produced two 30 second radio ads and will soon make them available to clubs and teachers for their use. The ads' cost will qualify for the Cooperative Advertisement reimbursement.

A new event, the Platinum Pairs, was held in Reno. 142 pairs played and it was a success.

The 2010 Youth NABC will be held July 29-31 at the summer NABC in New Orleans.

There are currently 90 school bridge classes registered for Spring 2010.

The ACBL will have a booth at the National Council of Teachers of Mathematics. Chris and Donna Compton will conduct a workshop entitled "Teaching Math Concepts and Applications Using Contract Duplicate Bridge".

Club managers now have the ability to post their daily game results on the ACBL website. Over 500 clubs are doing this and you can now add important messages, such as "No game today due to snow or storm".

Any sanctioned games held at clubs, with the sole exception of STACs, are to be counted in Ace of Clubs masterpoint races at Unit, District

and ACBL-wide levels.

The formula for masterpoints for special games at clubs have the appropriated M factor applied when there are masterpoint limitations.

The motion to raise the age for Senior to 60 was defeated, however a new event was approved, the SU-PER SENIOR PAIRS, age 70+, to be held the last two days of the Fall National (2 qualifying and 2 finals). Masterpoints won will not count toward Senior races or qualify for Grand Life Master eligibility but will give Platinum points. The first one will be in Orlando this fall.

In 2010-2011 NAP, the monetary award will become a fixed amount.

EXTENDED UNIT TEAM GAMES

A unit may use two of its three extended team game sanctions to run a 2 stage event, with a round-robin phase of at least 4 matches to qualify teams to a KO bracket.

CHARITY GAMES IN CLUBS

Any club that, in any calendar year, runs one or more allowed special local charity games that are sanctioned for extra masterpoints must make available for public inspection an accounting of all funds raised in such games no later than February 28th of the following calendar year.

If you have not been to many NABC's, the one in July of this year (New Orleans) promises to be a really good one with something for everyone, and if you get tried of Bridge they have great restaurants and Jazz.
