APPEALS AT NATIONALS

ACBL Tournament Directors shall hear and rule upon all appeals at NABC'S. All conduct and ethics or disciplinary matters shall continue to be referred to and heard by the NABC Tournament Committee or its assignees.

LEAGUE COUNSEL

The post of League Counsel is abolished effective August 1, 2016. The CEO shall hire as a full time employee an "in house Counsel" as soon as possible thereafter.

Anyone interested is this job should contact the ACBL CEO.

DISCIPLINARY COMMITTEE'S

For hearing at the ACBL Ethical Oversight, Disciplinary and appeals and charges committees, the advocate selected to appear at the hearing may be an attorney.

The Board created an Anti-Cheating Committee. This will be composed of at least five expert players.

TEAM ENTRY FEES

For team events held at NABC's, in which all team members receive full overall masterpoint awards, entry fees will be charged on a per person basis.

This is optional for Sectionals and Regionals. Your District Board will be discussing this if anyone has a strong opinion.

The cooperative advertising program will now be reimbursed at 50% with a max of \$500.

A full copy of the minutes will be on the ACBL website if anyone would like to examine it. Looking forward to seeing you at the tables.

This year, A, B, and C enter directly at the District level at the Dallas Memorial Day Sectional, so team up and show up to win a trip to the Washington DC NABC! These grassroots events are a great way to play in a major event and be subsidized by the District. Best of luck to all who enter! And congratulations to Bart Bramley and Ira Hessel for placing second in the Flight A NAP and to Wes Peirce and Thomas Rush for third in Flight C! We had a number of pairs representing us at all levels in the Reno NABC, but their finishes were great!



The Spring NABC in Reno was not District 16's finest: no wins, and just two seconds in NABC events. Be advised-I may have to ponificate (rabbificate?) about the finer points of contract or corporate law in my next column if I don't get more to work with at the summer nationals!

The elusive win is all Ira needs to become a Grand Life Master, the ACBL's highest rank (he's already surpassed the 10,000 masterpoint threshold). NAP Cycle Begins in June

Get ready for the new NAP cycle beginning in June! This year each District will have the opportunity to send 3 A pairs, 4 B pairs and 4 C pairs.

First you have the opportunity to earn half red/half black points 100% sectional rated points at your own local club. During June, July, and August, each club is allowed to hold two NAP games per sanction per month. Although you only need to qualify once to advance to the next level, you can win extra points all summer long!

This prestigious event is staged in quali-

fying rounds at the club, unit, and district levels. It culminates in a final held in conjunction with the 2017 Spring NABC in Kansas City.

The games are flighted: (Flight eligibility is based on the June 2016 masterpoint cycle which is run May 6, 2016: A (Open): B (0 to 2,500) and C (0 to 500. NLM) Pairs who qualify at the District level qualify to attend the NABC in Kansas City. ACBL pays a stipend of \$700/per person for those who qualify 1st in the District final and \$300/per person of the 2nd place qualifiers. In addition, there are no entry fees for the National event once you have qualified.

District 16 adds additional monies to each of the qualifying pairs. 1st gets and additional \$100/per person, 2nd gets \$200/per person, 3rd now gets \$300/per person, and 4th place in B and

C will also get \$200/per person.

ACBL awards the District with most tables in play at the club level an additional subsidy in flights B & C, so support your clubs when they hold qualify ing games. We have won this extra subsidy in flight B several times in recent years, but we need more C tables in play in order to get the additional subsidy in C.





DUMMY PLAY

Just a review as to the role of dummy in bridge: "The dummy in bridge takes no part in the play. He/she may not suggest by word or gesture any lead or play, but at the conclusion of play-not before-dummy may call attention to an irregularity, a revoke for example. In North America, when declarer shows out of a suit, dummy may act to prevent a revoke by asking, for example, "No spades, partner?" In many other countries and at world bridge championships, this is not permitted. Dummy may also act to keep his partner from leading from the wrong hand. For example, if declarer won a trick in his hand and calls a card from dummy, dummy may say, "You're in your hand." Finally, dummy (or either opponent) can alert declarer if he is placing a card from a trick horizontally (trick lost) when it should be vertical (trick won), but only when it's about to happen. It is inappropriate to call attention to this later.





We are full of pride and congratulations for Eddie Wold, who will be inducted into the ACBL Hall of Fame at the summer NABC in Washington, D.C. on July 21. On April 6 he was honored at Westside Bridge Academy with a 48-1/2-table Tribute Game. (Think of that: 48-1/2 tables! There was barely room for all the food, which was fantastic!)

The event hosts were Betty Starzec, Peaches Eads, and Patti Mullendore, along with WBA's owners Bert and Katherine Onstott and Jimmy and Jennifer Breihan. Dozens of others contributed food and balloons, and the Color Purple was everywhere! Toni Snow and Shawn Quinn shared stories. Bob Morris gave a moving introduction of Eddie, describing Eddie's winning of 15 national and 3 world events on the way to his 68,000 MPs! Eddie's mom and dad were there and beamed with pride, as did we all (and some of us even wiped back a few joyful tears).

Then Eddie thanked everybody and shared some of his experiences and love of the game with us. Eddie is the fourth bridge player from Houston to become an ACBL Hall of Fame Member, joining John Gerber (1998), Bobby Nail (2001), and Paul Hodge (2010). Eddie said he won his first National with Dan Morse as his partner, and won 7 of those 15 Nationals with partner George Rosencranz, whom he described as his "bridge father." When Eddie served on the Hall of Fame Committee, he was instrumental in helping Paul Hodge be elected. Eddie also told us that one of his favorites was Esta Van Zandt, and that John Zilic had helped him to "become a better bridge player." We all remember the recent story where Eddie's astuteness and keen observation, coupled with his love for the game's purity, helped him expose the Germans who cheated their way to a world championship but are now where they belong: banned from the game.

In addition to his big tournament wins, Eddie has won the Barry Crane Top 500 three times, the Mott-Smith Trophy also thrice, and the Lou Herman Trophy twice. Eddie is the kind of bridge player we could all hope to be. Not only is he one of the nicest guys you could ever meet, but he helps even the lowliest among us as he willingly gives tips to his competitors (when asked) and gives back to the game he loves so much. For the past ten years has spent his nontournament time conducting seminars

and workshops, providing private lessons, and teaching on cruises." Eddie said that he is "still learning" the game, and that he would give back every award he ever won if it meant he could start all over learning this fantastic game of bridge.

Fundamental Tip: And just while we're on the subject of Eddie Wold, do you know that he invented a bridge convention? It's called the "Wold Relay" and he figured it out during whose years he was winning so much with George Rosencranz. It's quite useful, serves as a way to find a bit more about your partner's hand, and it goes like this: Opener bids 1 of a minor, Partner bids 1 of a major, and Opener raises Partner's major (for example, 1C, 1H, 2H [opponents not bidding]). THEN, if Partner bids the *next level up*, it asks Opener to better describe his holding. The next level up from Partner's query says 3 of the agreed suit with a minimum hand, and the next level

says 3 of the suit with a maximum; the next level up from there says 4 of the suit with a minimum and the next level would be 4 of the suit with a maximum. It means Opener will not always have 4 of Partner's suit, and not every partnership can play this convention. In the example given, if Opener has raised Partner with 4 of the suit and 15 HCP (maximum without jumping), the bidding would be 1C-1H; 2H-2S (next level up, asking); Opener would respond 3H (4 levels up, skipping 2N, 3C, and 3D). Of course, you need to be able to count those levels fast, don't you?

Sad Farewell: Larry Gordon, a longtime Unit 174 member, passed away peacefully from heart failure on February 14, 2016, in Houston. He will be missed.
