

Questions about 2/1

The Questions: Our group bought and studied the Audrey Grant 2/1 book. We play it now. Recently we had a couple of problems:

1. We asked a life master friend if we could bid 2 clubs (to make a game force) if we only had two clubs in our hand. We then asked if we could do it with three in our hand.

The answer came back that we could not do it unless we had five in our hand.

She then said that if we were going to make a 2 club game force with less than 5 in our hand, we should alert it.

When we returned to the book, it said we could bid 2 clubs (for the game force) if we had only three in our hand. It also said we should only do that in rare cases.

Your thoughts?

2. My partner opened one heart. My hand got better with that bid. It got up to opening count, so I made a 2/1 game force. The opponent complained that I could not do it that way. Your thoughts? (sorry if I asked this before)

Answer: Good questions.

Bidding a 2 card suit should be alerted. I would not recommend making a game force with a 2 card club suit. You should bid as naturally as possible. The book is correct. I would only make a game force with a 3 card club suit if every other call was worse. There are hands you would make a game force with a 2C bid with a 4 card club suit.

People play 2/1 with lots of variations. I recently discussed 2/1 with someone who was taught constructive raises were part of 2/1. They can be, but they don't have to be.

The parts of 2/1 that are in stone are:

A 2/1 bid is forcing to game. However, some (like me) like to turn that off when the responder rebids their suit on their second bid. Some only play 2/1 over the majors.

A 1 NT by responder shows 6-12 points and is forcing or semi-forcing based on agreement. Originally most played this as forcing now, more (especially experts like Larry Cohen) play it as semi-forcing.

Everything else is up for partnership agreement.

Good for you for upgrading your hand when you had a good fit with your partner. Good players reevaluate their hand after each bid. You could and should make a game force when you have the values. However, you should consider making the game force with a splinter (assuming you have a singleton or void and the point range you agreed upon for a splinter) or a Jacoby 2NT bid. Both of those bids are more descriptive than the 2/1 bid.



editors note - one of the best ways to learn a new bidding system is to get a group of people together and practice playing that system till you all get the kinks out. Also note that most bidding systems have variations that you need to work out with your partner before playing.

Board 2: Partner preempts with 3C. I have great support...Can we make a slam?


Robert and his partner are sitting EW. Bidding:



In this example, Robert discusses the logic he used when he decided to make a 5C bid instead of exploring for a slam. It all comes down to making finesse in clubs. Based on percentages, he decides the safe bet is 5C.

In this example, Robert wants to show his interest in a slam after his

partner shows a strong hand by bidding 5S. While there is no perfect bid he discusses the logic he used in making a cuebid of 5D even though he doesn't have the exact hand for that bid. His partner reads that as interest and takes them to 6H.
