President's Message

This is my final message to our unit as your president. It has definitely been a busy year since I assumed office after the 2024 Election Sectional. I joined the unit board when I was elected in April 2022, and I have served as secretary, vice president, and finally president. I opted not to run for another term for many reasons, and I am looking forward to merely sitting at the table and waiting for my boards to come.

We have six candidates to fill positions on the board, and on Saturday of the Election Sectional we will know who will join the rest of the board for three-year terms. I wish all the remaining members on the board well, and I hope the newly elected members will enjoy their time serving on the board and the unit's players. The new president will be elected by the board at their meeting Monday immediately following the Election Sectional.

Those who have stepped up to serve on the board deserve the support and encouragement and gratitude of our unit's players. Any time you see a board member whether at the clubs or at a tournament or simply out and about, be sure to give them a big thank you for their service. The board is a group of volunteers who serve without compensation, largely because of their passion to support the game we enjoy. If you get a chance to volunteer to help at a tournament or do anything else to help, please do so. Send an email to the next president and provide your contact information so that you can be called on when volunteers are needed.

In the year ahead, the board will need to make important decisions about our path forward. We have lost more than five hundred area players since 2020. It has been a difficult road in our post-pandemic age. If we want our game to survive, we all need to pitch in to bring new players to bridge. I have told you in earlier missives that I took the Best Practices Teachers' Course and I started teaching in my neighborhood. I am one person, and I added five players to our number. It may not sound like much, but if each of us could bring one or two players to join us, we could actually increase in numbers rather than endure the slow decline we have been experiencing.

Inflation has made everything cost more, and making money at tournaments is not a given. For example, the cost of directors is up 12%. We raised table fees by \$1, or 4%. We cannot continue to be good stewards of the unit's treasury without increasing fees and cutting back on costs. It has been a break-even proposition for the most part; there have been losses as well. This is coming, so understand the dynamics and continue to come to the clubs and tournaments and support our game.

I look forward to seeing most of you at the Election Sectional on April 4-6. Please thank Peaches Eads and Lesley Kellet for chairing this tournament. To encourage everyone to come out for the annual meeting, we will have a complimentary breakfast and a subsidized \$15 lunch buffet on Saturday. Please vote for three of our candidates. If you have not voted on line, you can vote at the tournament prior to the games on Friday, and on Saturday morning.

Be sure to mark your calendars for the Nearly Summer Sectional which will be at the Shriners June 6-8. Karen Nussbaum and Gary Kerr, the tournament chairs, have already been very busy getting things ready for this tournament. We will be having parking lot security during the tournament, and on Friday we will have help from a police officer for left hand turns out of the parking lot on your way home. A good time will be had by all, so plan on coming out. Make sure to check out the flyer that is in this issue for all the details.

I bid all Unit 174 players a fond farewell as I exit the unit's board. Thank you for the support you have given me during my time on the board and as your president.

Dolores Aquino

Meet Dolores Aquino

Dolores Aquino was born and raised in Chicago and just as her names suggests, she is Italian which is not surprising given her roots. With that last name, it's likely possible she is a descendant of Thomas Aquinas (bet folks have heard that name before – nothing to do with bridge).

After graduating from high school, Dolores attended the Illinois Institute of Technology and lived at home with her family. She received her undergraduate degree in chemistry. Not ready to hit the work force yet, Dolores decided to pursue a PhD in chemistry at Ohio State University in Columbus, Ohio. It was while she was attending graduate school that she learned to play bridge. Like most of us, she started playing social bridge. To quote, "It was while I was in grad school that I got hooked."

Duplicate Bridge

Always one who excels, Dolores soon discovered the world of duplicate bridge. She took lessons and by 1975 she was a member of the ACBL. In December 1977 Dolores and her partner participated in a tournament where they won a Novice Pairs Trophy which she still has to this day.

Move to Houston

Following graduation from Ohio State, Dolores accepted a job at Exxon Research in Houston where she was a research chemist. When the oil bust happened, she was laid off and knocked around a bit and even sold real estate during that time before she found her true calling as a teacher. Dolores said she should have realized teaching was her true passion in life because while at Ohio State she was awarded Outstanding Teaching Associate in Mathematics and Physical Sciences. She taught chemistry at San Jacinto Junior College in Pasadena to students who needed the class so they could pursue their degrees in fields such as nursing. I asked Dolores if she ever converted any of her students and she said that over the years, she has heard from former students about how her class really is helpful to their careers. At San Jac (as we locally refer to the school) Dolores not only lectured chemistry but she also ran all the labs associated with the courses. While teaching at San Jac, she won the Outstanding Chemistry Teacher in a Two Year College award from the Houston Chapter of the American Chemical Society and also served as president of the national Two Year College Chemistry Consortium.

Dolores retired in 2017 so she could, "Play more bridge!"

When Dolores was transitioning from Columbus to Houston, she did it over the Christmas timeframe and was invited to participate in a New Year's Eve party where she met who would become her long-time bridge partner, Betsy DuDose. At that time, Dolores had a whopping 15 masterpoints and Betsy had about 2. Dolores played all over the city of Houston from the Clear Lake Bridge Club (CLBC), the Pasadena Bridge Club, the Bridge Studio (throughout five location changes) and remembers meeting Chris Compton when he was a teenager.

Reconnecting with Friends

Since I am a member of CLBC, I asked Dolores if she could remember any friends from that era. She mentioned Ann Faget with whom she has renewed her friendship, and they have started playing duplicate together again as well as socializing away from the bridge table. Dolores graciously allowed herself to be auctioned for the 2024 CBLC The Longest Day events where she and Ann reconnected. She also remembered Jim Shortt and Joe Choate who are both deceased.

Ann Faget invited Dolores to the CLBC 2024 Christmas Party and so Dolores decided to become a member at that time as well. Fun stuff! She'll even be participating in the club's annual Masterpoint Milestone Party and has already committed to the club's 2025 The Longest Day events again.

Volunteering

Dolores doesn't just play duplicate, she volunteers at the unit, district and club levels. She served on the Unit 174 board in the 1980s. After that she was the partnership chair for many unit tournaments. It was a great job for her because she knew so many people and could pair players well.

District 16 (D16) I/N Lectures

Dolores is the D16 Intermediate/Newcomer Lecture Series Coordinator. Like Dolores says, "The lecture series is the best kept secret in the district." She is reaching outside of the district to recruit what she prefers to call those volunteers, presenters, but she has always got her eye out for anyone in our D16 family to present. To remind our readers, these lectures are free and are on the fourth Saturday of each month at noon (central time). They are also recorded for folks who can't attend the live sessions, and those recordings can be found on the D16 website.

The Longest Day

Dolores' other passion is The Longest Day Alzheimer's fundraiser where she organizes the Bridge Club of Houston's (BCOH) events and advertises it among their membership. She said, "I'm committed to the cause because it is wonderful and beneficial."

Don't be Daunted

Dolores recently earned her Emeral Life Master but don't let that daunt you.

An I/N member of BCOH just let her know that prior to watching Dolores host a lecture, that person was intimidated. Now she realizes how wrong she was.

I first met Dolores when she came to my partner's and my table in an Open Pairs game during a Unit 174 tournament. I might have had 5 masterpoints. I never forgot her name or her face because of her kindness at that table.





He retired from his current position as Process Safety Manager and Technical Fellow at Lubrizol's Deer Park facility at the end of 2024. Fred is looking forward to having more time to devote to hobbies such as playing bridge at the local club and at tournaments. He says, "It has been a challenge to balance work with my bridge life!"







2025 ACBL North American Bridge Championship (NABC) Memphis, Tennessee, March 12 - 23

(A Short Report)

Unit174 had great representation in Memphis, and members brought home an impressive load of masterpoints – just under 2,500 individuals won points. The convention center was recently remodeled and looked good; those with cars could secure parking there for about \$12/day with in and out privileges. On the other hand, many attendees were disappointed that the trolleys which had run at the last NABC here were not running this time. The trolleys made getting around much of Memphis inexpensive, quick, and easy.

Food & Weather

There were a lot of wonderful restaurants, quite a few within a mile or so walk from the venue. Barbecue was well represented as you might imagine. There were also many small local restaurants that had menus with only a few main dishes, but those tended to be fantastic, reasonably priced, providing excellent service, and chef-owned – true delights! The weather was as varied as this author can recall at a national tournament. We had rain one day, fierce winds others, temperatures in the low 30s another day, and absolutely gorgeous days mixed in.

Masterpoints Overview & NABC Tournaments

Before we get into who won what, here is an overview of masterpoints and NABCs. Most people know about black (won at clubs), silver (at sectional tournaments, red and gold (at regional tournaments or one-day regionally-rated events at the NABC), and clear masterpoints (won online in ACBL games). There are also platinum masterpoints, won at an NABC in the toughest of events – at least two day, four session events, with some being three or more days of competition to finally get a winner. Typically, each day's contest eliminates half of the field, so the next day's competition is against a tougher and tougher set of opponents! The people you'll play against in those championship NABC events are the very best that bridge has to offer: Eddie Wold, Mike Passell, Mark Itabashi, Zia Mahmood, the Grossack brothers, Mitch Dunitz, Bob Hamman, David Berkowitz, Eric Rodwell, Mel Colchamiro, and Jeff Meckstroth are just some of the top ACBL players whose names you'll recognize – but the best, even if not known by name by Americans, come from all over the world.

Who can Play

I was asked by a club player if you needed to be invited or meet some criteria to attend an NABC – and the answer is (with the exception of a few events) no! The most common exceptions are the Grand National Teams (GNT) and North American Open Pairs (NAOP or NAP) that require you to participate and qualify at the district level to play in the national finals. Some specific events have qualifications: you must be a Life Master to play in the Life Master Pairs, you must have earned a Blue Ribbon qualification to enter the Blue Ribbon Pairs – but there is so much going on at an NABC that you'll never be stuck with no event to enter. Every day has both regionally-rated pair and bracketed Swiss Teams games. You'll be welcome no matter how many, or how few, points you have. There are always Gold Rush events going on, as well as 299er games. Almost every day features lessons by top teachers like Jerry Helms, Donna Compton, Vic Quiros, Jade Barrett, and so on.

How Unit 174 Members Fared

So who was successful at the Memphis NABC? Eddie Wold led the local winners with 132 masterpoints by placing 16th in the Jacoby Swiss Teams, 4th in the Silodor Open Pairs, and 9/16 in the Vanderbilt Knockout Teams – all platinum points, all tough championship events.

Buddy Hanby and Sally Wheeler each won 75 masterpoints, 15 in the

Rockwell Mixed Pairs (22nd), 25 in the Senior Mixed Pairs (8th), Nine in the Leventritt Silver Ribbon Pairs (all platinum), and 27 gold coming in second in a bracket 1 regional Swiss Teams event.

This correspondent earned 65 masterpoints in total. His best finish was 11th place in the Silodor Open Pairs with Vic Quiros of Phoenix for 31 platinum masterpoints and his best finish so far in an unlimited NABC+ event. He and Jack LaVigne also had a section place in the Flight A NAP where they represented District 16.

Young Kyo Chen won 58 masterpoints for an Open Pairs finish with his brother Ryo, and lots of scratches in other events. His big event (37 gold masterpoints) was winning the 0-2500 Swiss Teams event with his father and the teenage brothers Andrew and Charlie Chen of Austin (Unit 207). Kyo picked up 2.5 platinum points in the NABC+ Open Pairs along with his 56 gold.

Kyo's dad Hua Chen won almost as many masterpoints, 55, which were mostly gold with a smattering of platinum and red.

Dolores Aquino, who recently passed 7500 points and achieved Emerald Life Master, earned another 40 masterpoints, mostly platinum. Her standout wins were 40th overall in the Rockwell Mixed Pairs that started with 266 pairs.

Others who brought home lots of masterpoints include Lori Laufman, 36; Jimmy Breihan, 33; James Woodward, 32; Wanfeng Mou, 32, Susan and Bob Domsalla, both 31; Jane Boozalis, 30. I would like to call out Evan Marti's success. Although he has under 1,000 points, he and his partner Randy Pearson of Philadelphia (600 points) took on the challenge of the Nationals and entered two tough NABC+ events: the Silver RIbbon Pairs and the Lebhar IMP pairs. They placed in the overalls in both events, bringing home 24.5 platinum and 6 gold masterpoints in a regional event.

Taking home 20 - 30 masterpoints were James Zhan and Ying Peng who won 24 gold points by representing District 16 in the Flight B Golder North American Pairs and placing 5th. Also, Jack LaVigne, 28; Bob Morris, 28; Brigitte Sandifer and Paddy Fiorino, 26; and Ryo Chen (brother of Kyo) 23.

Jerome Tilles won 16; Betty Starzec 12; Kathy McDougall 10. Also bringing home masterpoints were Janice Rush, Chris Kollenberg, Harry Elliott, Loretta Cross, Joan Land, Georgiana Gates, Linda Drake, Judi Whaling, Kathleen Pflueger, B Haznedar, Anne Miraglia, Lindy Kahn, Marcia Lindsey, Betty Cartmell (who recently earned her Life Master rank), Richard Whaling, Ann Brinker Schwall, and Jeff McKee.

Any omission of point winners is my mistake and wholly unintentional.
